After socializing and house tours led by the actives for the alumni who had not seen the house in some years, the group enjoyed a fabulous dinner provided by Greek Life Food Services, the Chapter's meal provider.

During this dinner, introductions and speeches were made. Newly elected President **Anthony Budzinski '10** was presented with a personalized gavel by George Spasyk '49. Also during this time, the stu-

dent members were presented with the Alumni Association academic awards by Scholarship Chairman **Doug Sayranian '09** for the Fall 2007 Semester.

The **Bruce L. Koepfgen Highest Semester GPA Award** was presented to **Ryan Black '07** for the second straight semester, with a GPA of 3.85. **Shareef Amer '10** received the **William K. Hall Most Improved Semester GPA Award** with a 0.983 grade point average improvement. **Ryan Black '07, Lucas Hansen '10, Sean Ruwart '08, and Doug Sayranian '09** were presented with the **Paul Robertson, Jr. Above 3.5 GPA Award.**

Following the dinner, alumni and undergraduates moved to the George W. Spasyk Chapter Room to hold the first meeting of the newly formed Housing Corporation; a monumental occasion as we look to regain ownership of our historic home.

Alumni Meet to Form New Corporation

Following the 2008 Founder's Day Dinner held at 1601 Washtenaw, George Friess called to order the first meeting of the newly formed Sigma Alumni Association of Lambda Chi Alpha, Inc.

Sigma's original housing corporation was disbanded when the Chapter was closed in 1994 and title to the property was assumed by the General Fraternity. The new Alumni Association is a formal organization of the group that has been functioning since the Chapter was reestablished in 1998. It will continue to raise funds in support of the undergraduate chapter and the chapter house. The corporation will be working with the General Fraternity to regain management and ownership of the chapter house.

The board of directors of the new corporation consists of eight alumni members and four chapter officers: the chapter President, Treasurer, Alumni Secretary, and Alumni Advisor. Of the eight alumni directors, four will initially serve two year terms and four will serve one year terms. All terms of office for directors elected after this initial group was selected will be two years in duration.

The following officers of the corporation were elected: President—**George Friess**, Vice President—**Andy Knowlton**, Treasurer—**Dan Girdler**, Secretary—**Ethan Rein**. **Scott Timmer** will serve as Legal Counsel and an ex-officio member of the board. The other alumni members of the new corporation are **Scott Nielsen, George Spasyk, Richard Van House, and George Pomey.**

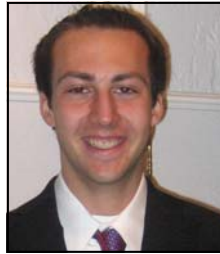

Winter Term Initiates By Chris VanDeusen '08

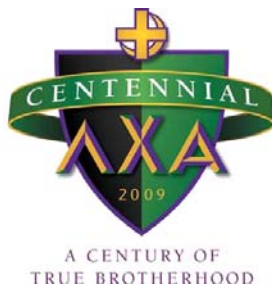
Eight undergraduate brothers were initiated on April 11, 2008. This was the largest class in recent semesters and is strong encouragement for the upcoming fall semester recruitment.

Philanthropy at Sigma is alive and well. This semester we will be sponsoring a number of events to raise food and money for the North American Food Drive (NAFD). NAFD is Lambda Chi Alpha's international philanthropy program that has raised over 27 million pounds of food for local pantries since it began in 1993.

We will once again be hosting our annual Teeter-totter-athon on the Diag to collect food and money. The chapter will be Trick-or-Treating for canned food with Alpha Phi Omega, a co-ed service fraternity, around Halloween. We will also be coordinating a collection program with local grocery stores. Friess Receives Order of Merit

Since 1935 the Fraternity has recognized unusual, lengthy, and dedicated service — particularly at the local chapter level — with election to the Order of Merit. At this summer's General Assembly, **J. George Friess '57** was awarded the Order of Merit, making him the third member of Sigma Zeta in this prestigious club within Lambda Chi Alpha. Only 312 brothers out of more than 270,000 initiates have been so honored.

George joins Sigma's two previous recipients of the Order of Merit, **Dr. John B. Van Why '32** and **Ross MacNaughton '27**.

George's alumni involvement with Sigma Zeta began in 1990, when he became a board member of the Housing Corporation. He was recruited to help lead the project to renovate the chapter house, a \$1.4 million effort.

The work was done quickly and effectively. The project was approved by the directors of the Housing Corporation in February of 1991 and the work was completed in the summer of 1993. The renovation of the chapter house was a total success.

Following the renovation project, George stayed active with the Housing Corporation as a director. He became the board president in 1994. Unfortunately, the undergraduate Chapter which re-occupied the totally renovated facility had lost its sense of brotherhood during the construction period, and conduct problems required the General Fraternity to suspend operations until 1998.

When Lambda Chi Alpha returned to campus that year, George worked as a

one-man Alumni Association. He made phone calls, sent letters, and raised crucial funds from alumni. Had it not been for George's efforts, the actives would have created a chapter that was totally disconnected from the alumni.

Within a few years, George had helped recruit alumni who worked with the Chapter to organize Sigma's 90th Anniversary and rechartering celebration in 2003. Later that year, George and the Alumni Association convinced the General Fraternity to return 1601 Washtenaw to Sigma starting in the Fall of 2004.

Once in the house, George has worked alongside alumni and actives at work days, given advice to officers, helped to purchase furniture, and acted as an intermediary between the Chapter and the General Fraternity.

Although George has done much work by himself as the president of the Alumni Association, his greatest contribution has been to recruit other alumni to join him in service to the Fraternity. The value of the contributions made by George Friess as a leader of Sigma Zeta cannot be measured, and the Brothers of Sigma Zeta owe him an enormous debt of gratitude.

Kidder Receives Order of Achievement Award

The Lambda Chi Alpha Order of Achievement Award was created in 1958 to honor those brothers who have achieved significant success in their professional careers. Those who have received the award constitute a litany of Who's Who in America, and include **Ernest Breech**, chairman and CEO of Ford Motor Co. and TWA; **Fred Borch**, president, General Electric Co.; **Ned Book**, president and chairman, Hershey Corp.; **Chester Gould**, creator of "Dick Tracy"; **Henry Iba**, 3-time U.S. Olympic basketball coach, basketball Hall of Fame; **Harry Blackmun**, Associate Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court and **Harry Truman**, 33rd President of the United States, among many others. Joining their ranks was Sigma's **C. Robert Kidder '67** at the 52nd General Assembly of Lambda Chi Alpha held at the Arizona Biltmore Hotel in Phoenix July 17-20. Sigma's **George Spasyk '49**, Executive Vice President Emeritus, had the honor of introducing Bob, who gave an inspiring keynote message to the more than 700 undergraduates and alumni in attendance at the Assembly's Lifetime Brotherhood Luncheon on July 19.

Bob Kidder started his journey to success with a bachelor's degree in industrial engineering from the University of Michigan and

a master's in industrial economics from Iowa State University. Following graduation, he went on to serve in the U.S. Navy as an officer in the Naval Civil Engineering Corps.

Following his naval service, he joined Chicago's McKinsey & Company, Inc, a global strategic management consulting firm. After six years in Chicago, Bob moved to Los Angeles to serve as senior vice president of Corporate Development for Dart Industries, where his responsibilities included strategic planning, merger and acquisitions and capital budgeting. In 1978, Dart acquired Duracell and in 1980 he joined Duracell as vice president, Finance and Administration for Duracell Europe. Several advances in the Duracell corporate structure led to his serving as president and CEO, and eventually chairman and CEO of Duracell International, Inc.,

After "retirement" of less than a year, Bob was approached to become the chairman and CEO of Borden. Under his direction, a new structure was put in place that gave way to new companies, including Borden Dairy, Borden Food and Wise Foods — each with its own board, capital structure, business policies and management. In 2003, he retired from Borden Capital, and since August 2006 he has served as Chairman and CEO of 3Stone Advisors LLC, a private investment firm he co-founded.

Bob currently serves on the Boards of Directors of Morgan Stanley and Schering-Plough. He is also on the Board of Trustees of Columbus (Ohio) Children's Hospital and Ohio University and is a part-owner of Sanford Winery and vineyards in the Santa Barbara wine country.

Bob has remained a loyal supporter of Lambda Chi Alpha, both at Sigma and at the General Fraternity level. He and his wife Mary have two grown children.

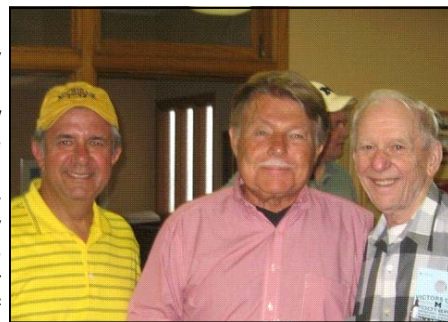

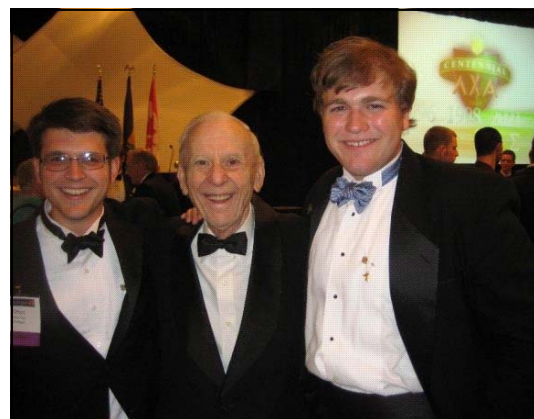
Bruce Galbraith '62 directed the General Assembly Chorus at the Purple, Green & Gold Brotherhood Banquet.

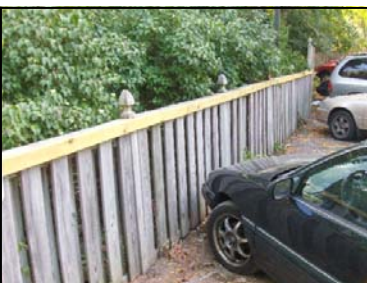
House Improvement

A few improvements have been made to 1601 over the summer. Most noticeably, the fence along the parking lot has been repaired to secure the property line. Inside, most of the light bulbs have been replaced with energy efficient compact fluorescent light bulbs to reduce our energy consumption.

We also hosted our annual Alumni/Active Workday on August 23 where the house was cleaned floor-by-floor and the exterior property was weeded and trimmed. Many alumni met at the chapter house to spend the day working hard to improve the grounds alongside most of the active chapter. The house looks great as we head into the fall school year and seek new recruits. Members of the Chapter moved into the house in time to spend the week prior to classes working on improving the house and recruiting new members.

Some major projects around the house remain to be completed. The Chapter will be working with Lambda Chi Alpha Properties and the Sigma Alumni Association to fix a leak in the roof, replace the kitchen floor, and replace some leaky pipes. Some work on the façade of the house also needs to be considered in the coming years. These improvements will help to preserve the house.
